Mission Statement

The mission of Advanced Technologies Academy is to empower a diverse student body to succeed in a competitive world by teaching academic concepts, technological skills, and ethical behavior.

Principal's Highlights

A-Tech is an all-magnet high school that is committed to challenging students through a college-preparatory curriculum and cutting-edge technological training in each of its eight program majors.

- A-Tech has been identified as one of three exceptional Nevada schools eligible for nomination as a Blue Ribbon School.
- The Nevada Childhood Cancer Foundation honored Liberty Leavitt, Magnet Theme Coordinator, as Volunteer of the Year.
- The Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics Teaching for Nevada was awarded to A-Tech teacher, Mike Patterson.
- The Nevada Board of Education awarded A-Tech a "Continuing Exemplary" designation for meeting Annual Yearly Progress.
- Nevada High School Proficiency Examination tenth-grade pass rates for math: 98%, reading: 100%; and science: 89%.
- Two A-Tech students were recognized at the first Annual White House Science Fair for their innovations in STEM.
- DECA's chapter won the Sweepstakes Award at state conference, and Geoff DeMaio received the award for Advisor of the Year.
- Magnet Schools of America named A-Tech a Magnet School of Distinction to recognize its continuing commitment to excellence.
- Architectural Design students placed 1-2-3 in the annual National Association of Women in Construction Design Contest.

Goals and Objectives

Goal 1

Advanced Technologies Academy will increase college readiness in the area of academic content knowledge.

Objective(s):

Increased achievement in the content areas of English, mathematics, reading, and science will be measured by a 2% increase from 2009-10 in the mean score on the SAT and ACT in each composite score.

Goal 2

Advanced Technologies Academy will increase college readiness in critical thinking, problem solving, and writing skills.

Objective(s):

Increased achievement in critical reading, mathematics, and writing skills will be measured by a 2% increase in the number of students who score at or above a score of 55 on corresponding sub-tests of the PSAT/NMSQT.

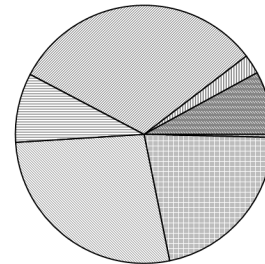

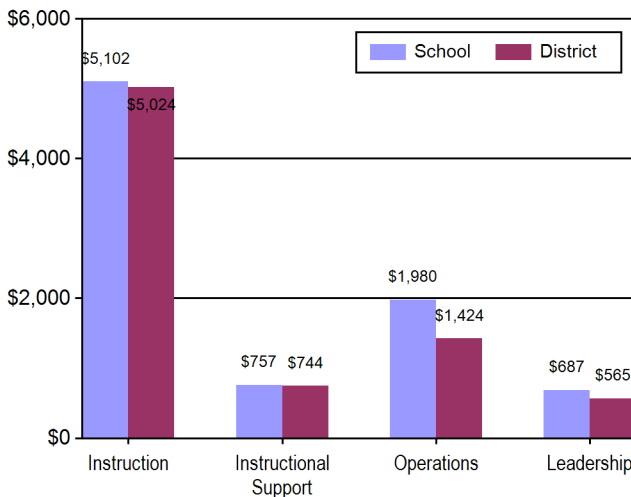
Per-Pupil Expenditures 2009-2010

Parent/Community Involvement

The A-Tech website, www.atech.org, provides parents and students access to staff information, activities calendar, course catalog, student/parent handbook, lottery information, directory information, and daily school and district announcements as well as individual teacher web pages with grades, assignments, and resources. Students and parents can e-mail teachers through InterAct, and live video announcements are broadcast into each classroom. ParentLink is updated daily with current grades, and it calls students' home phone numbers on all absences, important dates, and activities. Parents are invited to a fall Open House, two evening Community Information Nights, Counselors' College Night and to participate on the Parent Advisory Committee and various school committees. Student Ambassadors visit all CCSD eighth-grade schools each year through February to recruit for A-Tech. Parent newsletters and student newspapers are published electronically. Partnerships with companies provide advisory committees, internships, career fairs, and job shadowing experiences and bring community members to A-Tech.
